WHAT IS THIS PRODUCT?

Type: This product is a share of a Sub-Fund of Moorea Fund

Term: The Sub-Fund has a recommended holding period of 5 years.

Objective: Investment objective: The investment objective of the Sub-Fund Moorea Fund – High Yield Opportunity 2025 is to achieve the best possible investment returns over the pre-defined investment horizon. The performance objective is not guaranteed and may differ materially from actual results.

Investment policy: To achieve this objective, the Sub-Fund will invest principally in a selection of High Yield bonds issued by corporate issuers, bearing maturities with a maximum of six months and one day after 31 December 2025 (final maturity of the Sub-Fund).

The Sub-Fund's investment strategy is to manage, on a discretionary basis, a diversified portfolio of debt securities. The Sub-Fund may invest in all types of bonds (Investment Grade, High Yield or non rated bonds) in order to take advantage of all markets opportunities. High Yield (considered riskier or speculative) may represent up to 100% of the investments.

The Sub-Fund will maintain a diversification in terms of geography, sectors and issuers.

The Sub-Fund shall neither invest in distressed securities nor in defaulted securities. The Sub-Fund may invest in Contingent convertible capital instruments (CoCos), respecting a maximum of 10% of the Net Asset Value. It shall however neither invest in ABS nor in MBS.

SFDR Category: Article 6

Benchmark: The Sub-Fund is actively managed. It is not managed in reference to a benchmark.

Income: Distribution share class, the dividend is paid annually.

Investment horizon: The risk and the reward of the product may vary depending on the expected holding period. We recommend holding this product at least for 5 years or until 31/12/2025.


Currency: Your shares will be denominated in EUR, the Fund's base currency.

Processing and redemption orders: You can buy and sell your shares weekly.

Depositary: Société Générale Luxembourg

Intended Investor: This share class is intended for professional investors and eligible counterparties. The fund is dedicated to investors who seeks growth of capital and may bear total capital loss. Potential investors should have an investment horizon of at least 5 years.

WHAT HAPPENS IF Société Générale Private Wealth Management S.A. IS UNABLE TO PAY OUT?

Société Générale Private Wealth Management (SGPWM) is a management company licensed and supervised by the CSSF. SGPWM complies with organizational and operational rules, in particular as regards capital requirements. A separate pool of assets is invested and maintained for each Sub-Fund. The assets and liabilities of the Sub-Fund are segregated from those of other sub-funds as well as from those of the management company, and there is no cross-liability among any of them. The Sub-Fund would not be liable if the management company or any delegated service provider were to fail or default.

WHAT ARE THE COSTS?

The Reduction in Yield ("RIY") shows what impact the total costs you pay will have on the investment return you might get. The total costs take into account one-off, ongoing and incidental costs. The amounts shown here are the cumulative costs of the product itself, for three different holding periods. The figures are estimates and may change in the future. You should note that these costs are paid by the Company whereas the return that you may receive will depend on the Company's share price performance. There is no direct link between the Company's share price and the costs that it pays.
